

# "PET" Personal Energy Transportation "The Gift of Mobility"

The Oxford United Methodist Women sponsored an informative session on "The Gift of Mobility" at their last General Meeting on Saturday, May 19. The presentation was well attended and the church learned of the many ways to help with PET. PET (Personal Energy Transportation) is a three-wheeled, off-road wheelchair, operated by hand power. Built by a faith-based, non-profit, volunteer organization. PETs are delivered at no cost to people in developing countries who have lost the use of their legs due to birth defects, polio, diabetes, spinal chord injuries, landmines or war. Of the more than 18 million amputees around the world, about 80 percent of those live in developing countries. They ways you can help are:

- Become a Volunteer and help cut, sand, drill, weld, paint, assemble, package, and deliver PETs. People are also needed to set up and host informational displays at church and community events.
- Give/ Raise Funds. This is always a basic need in order to continue the PET project. It takes money to buy wood, metal, and parts, and to cover the expense of packaging, shipping, and distributing PETs. No one at PET receives a salary. PET is a charitable, faith-based 501©(3), tax-deductible organization.
- Find businesses that make or sell materials used in the building of a PET. You can ask them for donated items or for supplies to be sold to PET at low cost.

Hello Friends at Oxford United Methodist Church, For those of you who've never met me, I'm Crystal Sygeel, daughter of David and Joanne Sygeel. I've met many of you at Sunday worship services, Wednesday night suppers, and youth outings. Your kindness to me has been an extension of the Christian love you have for my parents. I've been humbled to be on the receiving end of that grace for so many years.

**Update on Dave Sygeel** 

Many of you are aware that on April 24, Dad was on his way home from a finance committee meeting, when he suffered a series of seizures, resulting in a mild accident. He was taken to Methodist hospital. He remained in ICU for several days before being discharged to Warm Springs rehabilitation Center, and then returned home on May 11.

To be clear, the seizures Dave suffered resulted in anterograde amnesia, meaning memories prior to the incident are intact but that no new memories are created. There is no cure for amnesia- no drug, no treatment, no pill- only time.

He is able-bodied, with a positive outlook on life. His long term memory is intact- so he remembers his family, his home, his vocation, and you- his companions in ministry. Thank you for all of the prayers, cards, phone calls and visits. Daddy, Momma, and I are all deeply grateful for everything you've done and continue to do for us...


house to house calling,


